


Home Environment Project



The Home Environment project allows young people to learn the principles of design as they explore different design elements for a variety of indoor rooms and outdoor spaces.

From choosing color schemes, accessories, décor, and more, Home Environment allows you to be the interior designer while you style a room or outdoor space by painting, choosing new floor covering, refurbishing furniture, updating accessories, and more!

Starting Out Beginner

- Learn and define the language, including design elements and principles.
- Plan and design your own space using new design techniques.
- Select budget and consider costs when designing your space.
- Practice selecting different furnishings to create different looks.

Learning More Intermediate

- Explore furniture styles.
- Create design boards to visualize living space changes and plans.
- Consider needs, wants, and timelines to make decisions.
- Learn proper care techniques for different elements, including furniture, flooring, etc.
- Coordinate fabrics and patterns for your space.

Expanding Horizons Advanced

- Select accessories to highlight features in your space.
- Consider lighting choices for your space.
- Use natural resources effectively.
- Be knowledgeable about energy efficient products.
- Implement place to Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Rethink in your space.

Inspire Kids to Do

Explore

"I might like to do this."

Youth who explore a variety of interests before high school, through experiences like 4-H camps and educational events, can develop early interest in a career path and improve their academic performance.

Learn

"I can do this."

4-H project-based learning, guided by adult volunteers, improves youth understanding of skills and concepts, as well as their ability to problemsolve and collaborate.

Practice

"I'm interested in this."

Youth who have participated in sustained hands-on learning and engaged with professional mentors and volunteers before entering high school are more likely to explore studies and potential career paths.

Experience

"I will be this."

Real-world application is key — 91% of Kansas 4-H members have a plan for reaching their goals. Youth that have been active participants in hands-on learning, combined with strong decision-making skills, are more able to effectively navigate life.

Expand Your Experiences!

Healthy Living

- Learn about the process of decluttering to minimize stress in lives.
- Donate unused furnishings to local charities.
- Explore how colors and textures affect moods.

Science and Agriculture

- Experiment with durability, stain-resistance, or color-fastness of a material for spaces.
- Study energy efficiency and its importance to the environment.
- Create a floor plan to scale.

Community Vitality

- Coordinate a furnishing swap in your community to minimize costs on updating spaces.
- Assist with renewing community spaces, such as parks, to create an inviting and safe environment for community members.
- Organize or help with a recycling program in your community.

Communication and the Arts

- Create a tutorial video on how to refinish a piece of furniture.
- Demonstrate how to select a color scheme using the color wheel.
- Teach others the proper disposal methods for refinishing materials, including paint.

Career Development

- Explore careers through job shadowing and researching, including interior design, landscape architecture, professional organization, community and regional planning, marketing, publishing and advertising.
