

Communications Challenge: Dynamic Displays



Visual aids such as posters, electronic slides, charts, models, and photos can help an audience understand and remember what a presenter is telling them. Visuals should have a definite purpose and be used only if they make the presentation more effective.

Visual aids can help you remember what to do and say next and are preferred to notes.

- IF using a computer, print sections on regular paper to arrange your poster in draft form. Make adjustments before printing on cardstock.
- IF hand-writing, practice and write a draft before hand lettering your final copy.
- Arrange pieces on board to check spacing and visual appeal before permanently attaching.
